- is headquartered in Columbus, Ohio;
- serves more than 5 million customers in 11 states;
- ranks among the nation's largest generators of electricity, owning approximately 31,000 megawatts of generating capacity that includes all or part of nine plants (five coal, three natural gas and one hydro) located in Ohio; and
- owns the nation's largest electricity transmission system, a more than 40,000-mile network that includes more 765 kilovolt extra-high voltage transmission lines than all other U.S. transmission systems combined.

- AEP's utility units operate as AEP Ohio, AEP Texas, Appalachian Power (in Virginia and West Virginia), AEP Appalachian Power (in Tennessee), Indiana Michigan Power, Kentucky Power, Public Service Company of Oklahoma and Southwestern Electric Power company (in Arkansas, Louisiana and east Texas).
